Friday evening at 8 pm the phone rang .It was the Kidney specialist.” I have just read Gils hemoglobin from the blood test taken this morning. You must call the ambulance immediately and get him to hospital for blood transfusion. He is bleeding internally. ”

Most doctors would not have read that at 8pm on a Friday night. I would not have known about it until Monday and possibly by that time Gil would have been dead. He had 4 units of blood and still the doctors are not sure where he is bleeding. He will be transported to the nursing home sometime today as originally planned.

God stepped in again and supplied the doctor he needed. God has also given me several opportunities to witness over the phone and face to face with several neighbours. Several saw the ambulance take him to hospital and asked about him. I was able to assure them that I slept well that night here at home after praying to God to take Gil home to heaven if this was his time. ”How do you know he is going to heaven”....was the question I was given. Well,God says whosoever calleth on the name of the Lord shall be saved. That is Gods promise. The gift of salvation through Jesus dying for our sin on the cross is a gift, God never takes back that gift. Gil accepted that gift when he was a teenager, he asked Jesus to forgive him of his sin and save him. That day he received the gift of eternal life. He will go to heaven and live forever with God and all who have ever trusted Him to be their Saviour. So many are living in fear of death these days with so much of it surrounding us. God has given me assurance, Blessed assurance, that Jesus is mine, Gil is in Gods Care there is nothing to fear when you know Jesus Christ as your personal Saviour.

Many of you are in lockdown like us. Maybe you have time to scan over these names of my close neighbours and friends and pray for them to be saved.
